

2010 Volunteer Trail Building Events: Madrone Wall

WHAT: The Madrone Wall Preservation Committee is coordinating with Clackamas County Parks, REI-Clackamas, Mazamas, Trailkeepers of Oregon, and ClimbMax Mountaineering to construct hiking trails at the Madrone Wall site. Please join one or all three of our scheduled trail building days at Madrone Wall in 2010. This is a great event if you are looking for an environmental public service project (Scouts, Eco School Groups, Religious Groups, Civic Groups, etc.).

REQUIREMENTS:

- **ONLINE REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED. To participate, you MUST register.**
- Please ONLY register to volunteer if you will truly show up as your registration occupies one spot and if you do not show up it takes the place of someone who could have registered and participated.
- Minimum age is 12.
- The quantity of volunteers for each trail building day is capped at 100 people.
- Register online at www.rei.com/clackamas. Scroll down to "REI CLACKAMAS CLASSES AND EVENTS" and refine search with appropriate date range to register for trail building events.

DATES:

- 23 May 2010 (Sunday): 2010 Trail Building Day #1 of 3
- **27 June 2010 (Sunday): 2010 Trail Building Day #2 of 3**
- 12 September 2010 (Sunday): 2010 Trail Building Day #3 of 3

SCHEDULE:

- 8:30 a.m.: Meet at Carver School, sign County's liability waiver, carpool Madrone Wall site
- 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.: Volunteer Trail Building
- 1:00 – 2:00 p.m.: BBQ lunch provided by Climb Max Mountaineering at Madrone Wall site
- 2:00 – 5:00 p.m.: Rock climbing allowed at Madrone Wall for volunteers ONLY and on trail building day ONLY*
- 5:00 p.m.: Depart Madrone Wall site and carpool back to Carver School parking lot

MEETING LOCATION: Meet at Carver School (16077 S.E. Highway 224, Damascus, Oregon) at 8:30 a.m. and carpool 2.2 miles to/from Madrone Wall site

BRING:

- Appropriate safety equipment (leather work gloves, work boots, hard hats, bicycle or climbing helmets, safety glasses, first aid kit, etc.)
- Water, snacks, hat, sunscreen
- Dress for weather (rain or shine!)
- Long sleeve shirt and pants only as there is a lot of poison oak and blackberry brambles on the site
- Trail Building Tools: pick axes, grub hoes, mcloeds, pulaskis, shovels, digging tools, garden rakes, sledge hammers, pry bars, hand saws, loppers, buckets, wheelbarrow, etc.

Trail Building Leads NEEDED: IF you are an experienced trail builder and would like to lead a small group of trail building volunteers, please contact Keith K. Daellenbach, MWPC Director, at kdaellenbach@att.net, ASAP and let him know which date(s) you can serve as a trail team leader.

*Clackamas County has agreed to allow rock climbing at Madrone Wall for the first time in nearly 13 years ONLY on the three trail building days and ONLY for those that volunteer to build trails. Please continue to respect Clackamas County's current "No Trespassing" posting at the site at ALL OTHER TIMES.
